Summary

The "FEBS Educational Workshop on Molecular Life Sciences" has been taken place in the Conference and Cultural Center of the University of Patras, Greece on October 3rd, 2018 (https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSd7hqvO-

uRpQCsY6LNQgVLsFWZbdTsavQo74b1NcoZyu7LaOQ/viewform).

The workshop, which was mainly addressed to graduate and PhD students, young scientists and teachers of molecular life sciences, was focused on Cellular Biology, Biological Chemistry and Molecular Biology Education by introducing new trends in education as well as presenting important tips for the future scientists. The experts provided key knowledge to enhance excellence and innovations in Biochemistry and Molecular Biosciences and tips for writing successful manuscripts.

One of the goals of this workshop was to provide a forum for panel discussions and discussions into small groups with the experts for sharing current issues in molecular life sciences and skills necessary for a molecular life scientist. The main objectives of the

workshop were: Key Knowledge and Skills for Molecular Life Sciences, Quality assurance issues in education, PhD training and How to write a scientific paper, which have been delivered through lectures by extinguished members of the FEBS Network, small-group discussions with the speakers and produce-discuss reports of groups, encouraging the interaction of young scientists with the invited experts in discussions about science and career development.

Small group discussions created a very friendly atmosphere for interactions between the participants as well as the young scientists with the outstanding experts. Lunch and Coffee breaks served at the Conference and Cultural Center of the University of Patras.
